ATC COVID-19 Standard Operating Procedure: All Visitors All visiting test participants/observers must: Have ATC approval for onsite visitors to witness or participate in a test Be able to answer daily medical screening questions: Are you feeling sick today? Have you had close contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19? Have you travelled outside the local area? Wear a face covering at all times while on APG. Minimize sharing of workspaces and equipment. **Everyone at all times:** Wear face coverings/masks when working within 6 ft of other personnel and in all buildings. Monitor your health and inform your Supervisor/Escort of any changes Practice hygiene standards and keep areas clean Department of the Army: International If arriving from a CDC Travel Health Notice Level 2 or above location, complete a 14-day quarantine (per FRAGO 18 to HQDA EXORD 210-20 and DoD Force Health Protection Supplement 14). **Travelers** CDC: All air passengers coming to the United States, including U.S. Citizens, are required to: get tested no more than 3 days before you travel by air into the United States and show your negative result to the airline before you board your flight, or show documentation of recovery from COVID-19 (proof of a recent positive viral test and a letter from your healthcare provider or a public health official stating that you were cleared to travel). References: Force Health Protection Guidance Supplement 14 Requirement for Proof of Negative COVID-19 Test or Recovery from COVID-19 for All Air Passengers Arriving in the United States | CDC **Maryland Department of Health: Additional** When practicable: **Recommendations** Immediately get a COVID-19 test upon arrival in Maryland or within 72 hours before travel to Maryland. Asymptomatic individuals shall self-quarantine while awaiting test results. (non-mandatory) Get a second COVID-19 test within 72 hours of arrival in Maryland because of the novel coronavirus' incubation period. Notes: Travel to the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Virginia, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and the States of Delaware and West Virginia by Marylanders is exempt from this recommendation. Employee commuters who leave/enter the state on a regular basis and have work-based COVID-19 screening procedures do not need to guarantine. Employees who occasionally travel to or from Maryland for work-related purposes shall, to the extent reasonably practicable, comply with the guarantine and testing requirements above.
